GENERAL OUTCOMES FEEDBACK, ROUND 2!

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General Comments

Below are some general things that I thought I would share with you all after reading your outcomes. Some of this information may not be completely applicable to you personally, but this is an overall guide that you all can use as feedback.

Evidence

--> label all of your evidence by #'s (with labels or Sharpie on the sheet protector)

EVIDENCE # __

--> When referencing your evidence in your outcome, place the citation it at the end of your sentence, like this (see evidence #__).

--> If your piece of evidence is applicable to all of what you are saying, place your evidence citation at the bottom of your outcome.

Additional Experiences

--> Remember, the ideal # of additional experiences is **3- 5, or more!**

--> If you are writing something in your additional experiences column, be sure to **reference it**, and **introduce/explain** this experience in your outcome description. If you just list something there without explaining it/incorporating it... it doesn't count.

Referencing Something Not Learned in HDF 190

--> If you are referencing something you have done your own research on, be sure to **CITE** the source you have received your information from. Print it out and place it in as evidence, and also list something like "Private Research" under the target class column.

Amount of Outcomes

--> By now you should have completed **10 outcomes**. If not, you are behind! Remember you are required to have 30 completed for the class! Keep the good work up, and reference the criteria rubric when crafting your responses.

Comments

--> I again spent a great deal of time reading over your responses. I hope that my comments will be helpful in your revising process. As you know, I write a lot of comments-- this is all for your benefit! If you see a lot of writing don't think you did a bad job. I hope you will use my comments and the rubric as a guide for revision, and when formulating your future outcomes.
